

REGULATIONS FOR CONDUCTING CLASSES WITH STUDENTS IN THE LABOR AND OPERATING ROOM

1. Purpose of the regulations

The regulations define the principles of organization, safety and compliance with epidemiological procedures during didactic classes with students in the Labor and Operation Block. The purpose of the regulations is to ensure safe and effective learning conditions for students and to maintain high hygiene and epidemiological standards.

2. General rules

- The maximum number of students staying in the Operating Room at one time is 6 people, regardless of the number of assistants conducting the classes.
- The presence of students in the Operating Room requires prior approval by the Operator or the Head of the Labor and Operation Room and adjustment of the number of students to the specifics of the planned surgical procedure.
- Each student participating in classes in the Labor and Operation Block is obliged to familiarize themselves with the regulations.
- During didactic classes, the number of people entering and leaving the Operating Room should be limited to the necessary minimum.

3. Conditions of participation

- Students may only stay in the Operating Room under the supervision of the assistant conducting the classes.
- Students should be familiar with and adhere to the principles of asepsis and antisepsis in force in the Labor and Delivery and Operating Ward.
- Students are required to wear appropriate protective clothing, including:
 - Scrub,
 - Clean protective shoes,
 - Surgical mask covering the nose and mouth,
 - Surgical Cap covering the hair.
- Before entering the Operating Room, students must undergo a hygiene procedure, including hand disinfection.
- It is prohibited to use mobile phones or other electronic devices in the Operating Room.
- After completing the classes, students are required to return reusable protective clothing to appropriately marked containers.

4. Organization of didactic classes

- The assistant conducting the classes is responsible for the organization and course of didactic classes.
- Students should be in the designated observation zone, without interfering in the operating field.
- The assistant conducting the classes is responsible for reminding and for observing the principles of asepsis and antisepsis before each procedure.

5. Epidemiological safety procedures

- Students must comply with the principles of dividing zones into "clean" and "dirty" and follow the instructions of the medical staff.
- In emergency situations, students should immediately leave the Operating Room in accordance with the staff guidelines.
- Failure to comply with the rules of the regulations may result in immediate termination of the student's participation in the classes.
- Students are obliged to immediately report any incidents that may affect epidemiological safety.

6. Final provisions

- The regulations enter into force on the day of their approval by the Head of the ward
- Each assistant conducting the classes is obliged to familiarize students with these regulations before the start of the classes.
- The regulations are subject of verification and updating in order to adapt to regulations and epidemiological guidelines.
